I Jane McCready or Clark, Wife of Thomas Clark, Sailor, hereby solemnly declare in presence of a Alexander Baird and James Brown both Assistant Inspectors of the Poor of the Barony Parish of Glasgow that I am a native of England and was born in Thomas Street Liverpool, I left Liverpool on Monday night last and came to Glasgow in search of my husband who I was informed had arrived at Greenock from some of the West India Islands, after a fruitless search for my husband in Greenock I again came to Glasgow in search of him but did not find him, and I am now quite destitute and friendless and in consequence I applied to the Inspector of the Barony Parish aforesaid to be sent home to my native place and Parish in Liverpool, I was admitted into the Poorhouse of the said Parish last night and I now earnestly petition and request that the Inspector of the said Parish send me home to Liverpool . In witness thereof this Petition and request is subscribed by me at Glasgow the thirtieth day of March Eighteen hundred and sixty one, before these witnesses Alexander Baird and James Brown aforesaid. – Jane Clark
